NEW SHORT GAME AREA OPEN



Santa Rosa Golf & Beach Club has officially opened its new short-game area at the golf club in September. Selected by Golf Inc. Magazine as one of the Top 10 most innovative people in golf, Bill Bergin of Bergin Golf Designs was chosen as golf architect for this highly anticipated project.

Short-game facilities are one of the fastest growing trends at successful golf clubs around the country, known to improve scoring and playing abilities for golfers of all skill level.

"The game of golf continues to evolve and for us to retain and attract people to golf, we need to invest in ways that innovate and improve as well," said Carter Murchison, PGA director of golf for Santa Rosa. "With time constraints due to schedules or age, a short-game area allows golfers to maximize their full potential while off the course."

The acre addition includes a 6,200 square foot green complex, two bunkers - both representing two different types of bunker shots and the room to hit both chip and shots. This space is the perfect place for members to work on those important shots around the green. Another added benefit to the short game area is for the beginner golfer and to our members who have children who are in the beginning stages of learning to play golf. On days where members are not able to dedicate to a full day on the course or members introducing the game to their children, 60 minutes on the short game area becomes more manageable. This type of practice and training ultimately leads to more prepared golfers and improved scores on the course.

Looking ahead to 2021, the club also plans to break ground on a more than \$3.3 million dollar renovation to its golf course. During the 6-8 month construction of the golf course, the short-game area will play a large role in keeping club members entertained.
